



Deputy Fire Chief

Under the direction of the Director of Emergency & Protective Services, the incumbent's primary function is to plan, direct and oversee the daily operations of the Iqaluit Fire Department. The incumbent will be responsible for the management and training of over 30 volunteer and career emergency service providers. Emphasis will be placed on the implementation of a comprehensive training and recruitment program encompassing all disciplines of emergency work and ensuring all equipment and apparatus are fully operational. The successful candidate will take a key role in incident command of emergency incidents and assist the Director of Emergency & Protective Services in meeting departmental goals and objectives. The Deputy Fire Chief serves as the acting director during the absence of the Director of Emergency & Protective Services.

The successful candidate should possess the following NFPA certifications; 1001 II, 1021 III, 1041 I, 1002, as well as hold a current Emergency Medical Responder certificate. Additional NFPA certifications such as 1031 and 1033 are an asset as well as industry recognized diplomas in the area of Fire Service Leadership. Certification combined with 3 to 5 years progressive leadership and incident command experience, excellent written communication, public relations, and the demonstrated ability to deal effectively with stressful situations is essential.

The ability to communicate in Inuktitut is an asset

Equivalencies that include a combination of education, knowledge, skills and abilities to formal education may be considered.

The annual salary for this position is \$83, 376.85 plus an annual settlement allowance of \$21, 300.00 and an excellent benefits package.
